






# WHERE IN THE MUSEUM

Roman Soldier School will happen in the Activity Centre. The floor is all on one level. One wall is all glass with sliding doors so you can go outside.



There will be fabric banners to read and a TV with information about Magna Roman Fort.

This room will be brightly lit and have a sensory projector to interact with.




# WHAT YOU WILL SEE

Roman Solider School runs throughout July and August at the Roman Army Museum. You will see children and adults dressed up as Roman soldiers holding wooden swords and shields.



You will also see our volunteers in Blue or Red Jackets.



# WHAT YOU WILL SEE

During the event, we do marching drills, hobby horse obstacles, and archery. You will see toy horses, archery targets and bows and arrows.



# WHAT YOU WILL HEAR

This can be a noisy event. You will hear Latin commands being spoken, the sound of marching, wooden swords and shields banging, and coconuts tapping each other to sound like horses hooves.



# WHAT YOU WILL TOUCH

This is a very hands-on activity. You can feel a replica Roman legionary shield and wooden training sword. You can also feel replica armour, *lorica segmentata*.
